



## Euregional tickets

Explore three countries by bus and train

Climb onboard the bus and train network and discover the Meuse-Rhine Euroregion! This Euroregion comprises five regions in three different countries: the region of Aachen (city and district of Aachen and the districts of Düren, Heinsberg, and Euskirchen) on the German side, the southern part of the Dutch Province of South Limburg, the Belgian Provinces of Limburg and Liège, and the German-speaking community of Belgium.

The Aachener Verkehrsverbund (AVV) public transit authority is connected to the southern part of the Dutch Provinces of Limburg and Liège by numerous bus and train lines. The fare is based on the pricing structure of the line you choose to complete your journey: the AVV fare system, Arriva fare system (the Netherlands), TEC/SNCB fare system (Belgium), a fare supplement, or the region3tarif fare system.

## region3tarif

Discover the tri-country border region in comfort

Reach out to our neighbors in the tri-country border region even more easily with the region3tarif fare system. You can ride the bus on cross-border journeys with just one ticket.

The region3tarif fare applies to journeys in the city of Aachen, the Belgian regions shown on the map, and the lines indicated in Vaals, Netherlands.



Take your pick from the following types of tickets:

- Single tickets
- Day tickets
- Monthly/annual passes
- Fare supplement tickets

Tickets for region3tarif journeys are available at the following locations:

- Single and day tickets can be purchased in the ASEAG, BVR and TEC public transit vehicles and from the ASEAG ticket vending machines.
- Monthly/annual passes and fare supplement tickets for school-age children and university students are available for sale at the ASEAG and TEC customer service centers.
- Holders of **AVV-Job-Tickets** can receive fare supplement tickets from their respective employer.

There are fare supplement tickets for holders of AVV-Job-Tickets and for school-age children, trainees, and university students for rides in the entire fare zone in Belgium.

Holders of a monthly or annual region3tarif pass (adult) can travel with one other adult and up to three children under 15 years from 7 p.m. in the evening and on weekends and national holidays in the respective fare zone at no additional price.

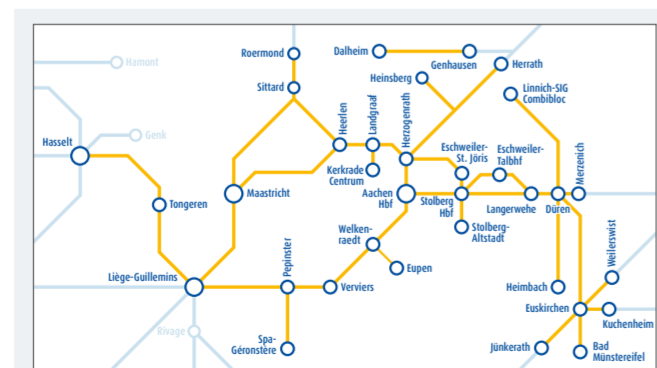
## euregoticket

1 ticket + 1 day = 3 countries

The euregoticket is the best choice for those who want to discover the Meuse-Rhine Euroregion. It can be used for journeys on nearly all of the Meuse-Rhine Euroregion bus and train lines and it only costs €18,50 for the entire day.

The euregoticket also acts as a ticket for the entire family on weekends and national holidays in Belgium, the Netherlands, and Germany, which means that two adults and three children (under 12 years) can travel together!

The ticket is available for purchase at participating public transit authorities.

## AVV-Heerlen fare supplement zone

A smart way to travel to southern Limburg (NL)

The AVV-Heerlen fare supplement zone is a convenient way to travel between the AVV and Heerlen transit systems, especially for commuters. Advantages of this special fare include:

- Journeys with the train RE 18 to the Eygelshoven Markt, Landgraaf, and Heerlen stations
- Journeys on the No. 44 bus line (ASEAG/Arriva) to Heerlen and
- Journeys on the No. 74 bus line (ASEAG) to AVANTIS

You can use all Arriva lines and trains until the stations Heerlen-Woonboulevard and De Kissel to continue your journey within the 6600 „Zentrum Heerlen“ fare zone. It is not possible to purchase tickets for the AVV-Heerlen fare supplement zone at the Heerlen-Woonboulevard station. However, you can validate tickets here that were previously purchased from authorized agents. Alternatively, you can use your smartphone to purchase a ticket.

Take your pick of the following fares for journeys:

- Single tickets
- 4-trip tickets (adult)
- Weekly passes (adult)
- Monthly passes (adult)
- Aktiv-ABO/Aktiv-Duo (for senior citizens)

Points of purchase for the AVV-Heerlen fare supplement zone:

- You can purchase **single and 4-trip tickets** from ticket vending machines, the bus driver (only single tickets are available in Arriva buses), authorized ticket offices, and customer service centers.
- Weekly and monthly passes** consist of a free customer card and a fare card, which you purchase additionally. You can receive customer cards from the customer service center of the respective public transit authority. **Fare cards** (weekly/monthly passes) are available for purchase from AVV ticket offices and customer service centers, and to some extent from ticket vending machines or the bus driver directly.

Find the right fare and view ticket prices

Ticketing in the cross-border fare supplement zone is similar to the AVV fare system. It consists of special fare categories that depend on the length of the journey. It is easy to determine which ticket is right for you: Just consult the table of fare categories that corresponds to your desired destination and select the right ticket from the table for you.

## OV-chipkaart

The Province of Limburg uses the **OV-chipkaart**, an electronic chip card, for its public transit system. This chip card is valid throughout the Netherlands. There is an anonymous chip card that can be purchased from the **ASEAG** customer service center (KundenCenter) in the Aachen Central Bus Station (Bushof), the ASEAG ticket office in the Aachen Central Train Station, and the DeutscheBahn office in the Herzogenrath railway station. You can also purchase a non-transferable OV-chipkaart, for which you can add credit to your personal card's balance by credit card or PayPal. ## Helpful hints

- Please remember to validate your single tickets before beginning your journey if you purchased them in advance.
- Children under 4 years travel for free on cross-border journeys. Children 4 to 14 years need to purchase a child's fare.
- Dogs travel for free.
- Weekly and monthly passes (adult) are transferable.
- Monthly passes (adult) also provide free travel to one other adult and up to three children under 15 years on weekdays after 7 p.m. and all day on weekends (in Germany) (does not apply to special on-call public transit in the district of Düren).

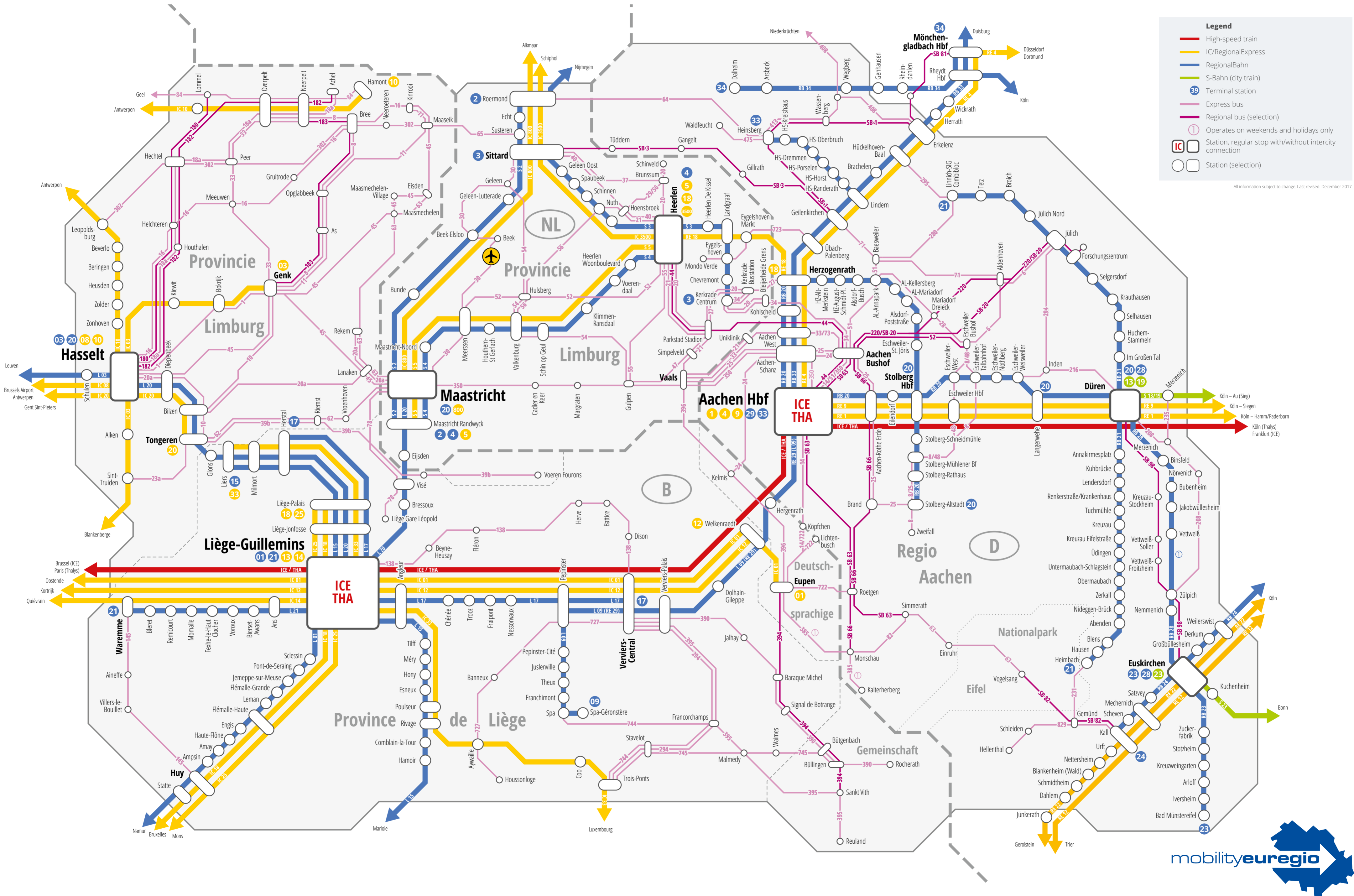
